

December's Book Recommendation

The following is December's book recommendation from Karen Kennedy, Director of Promotions.

"Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus" written by Nabeel Qureshi.


If you ever wanted a more personal and intimate information concerning the Muslim faith, this book is a must read.

Nabeel Qureshi was born and raised in a loving Muslim home, where his parents raised him to love and respect Allah and the Quaren. In fact, his father softly whispered into Nabeel's ears a traditional prayer, directing him to Allah, the moment after he took his first breath. Those words were the first words Nabeel ever heard.

Nabeel's parents immigrated from Pakistan and settled in California where his father served in the US Navy. Nabeel describes his life in America as a Muslim who was set out to defend his faith. However, as a teen, he realized that he was torn between two diametrically opposite realities: the Christian/Muslim beliefs and the eastern/western world view. In college, he continues to banter with other intellects concerning Islam. His journey took a different turn when he would embark in deep friendship and faith conversations with David, a fellow student and Christian.

The book then describes his intense wrestling that would eventually lead to his accepting the claims of Jesus, and the turmoil of denying the faith he loved, Islam, and being shunned by his family.

Since we often have a shallow understanding of other religions and cultures, this book shows the intense conviction and inner dealings of a completely different faith. Personally, it has helped me to understand their world view through Nabeel's personal account. My prayer is that this book will be a catalyst to love those of the Islam faith more intensely.
