We See Death Differently

We've considered that the Resurrection causes us to look at sin differently, but now we must consider that the resurrection causes us to look at death differently...the by-product of sin. Seems obvious, right? His Resurrection ensures our resurrection! And yet, we nonetheless struggle with death, don't we? But the Resurrection moves us to look at death, not as a positive, but as "the portal to eternal life" as the funeral rite rightly calls it. More than that, however, the Resurrection of Jesus moves us to remember that some day all flesh will be raised from the dead and those of us who believe in Jesus will be "raised to eternal life." Through the Resurrection of Jesus we see death differently!

(Infant to age 4):

Nursery: Located on the lower level, the nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent. The nursery can be accessed through the door on the southwest side of the Connection Center.

Communion:

The Lord's Supper or Communion is a Biblical event, given by Jesus for the strengthening of our faith and the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26). God's Word is very clear that when we receive the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper we also literally/physically receive the actual body and blood of Jesus (1 Corinthians 10:16 and 1 Corinthians 11:23-30). If you are a baptized Christian who trusts in Christ's presence, recognizes your sinfulness, and desires not only to be forgiven of those sins, but also needs strength from Jesus to amend your daily life, then you are welcome to join us! If you do not believe Christ is present, or are unsure of what you believe and want further explanation, then please feel free to speak with one of our Pastors at a convenient time. (We provide both non-alcoholic wine in the center of the tray and gluten-free wafers in containers.)
